

Translated as "holy stones", a play on the soils and history of Chateauneuf-du-Pape, the second red wine to Chateau de Nalys is an altogether different animal. Differing varietal and plot selections, fermentation, and aging result in a wine that is rich and ample, yet offers immense direct and approachable pleasure; a wine of red fruits, supple structure and brightness. In comparison to the Grand Vin, this wine relies both on varieties and plots that bring freshness, and a vinfication entirely in stainless steel and foudres that

## **VINEYARD**

Location and Soils:

- 33% Nalys: fine, red sandstone and sandy clay, with some limestone and soft sandstone
- 34% La Crau: the famous galets, large round pebbles derived from the Rhone river
- 33% Bois Senechal: slightly smaller galets and sandier, less structured soils than La Crau

Grape Varieties: 69% Grenache, 20% Syrah, 5% Cinsault, 4% Muscardin, 1% Counoise, 1% Mourvedre Vine Age: Vines average 45 years of age

Yields: 35 hl/ha

Farming: Vineyards are farmed organically, awaiting certification

## WINEMAKING

Fermentation: Manual harvest and sorting followed by vinfication in stainless steel lasting around around

Aging: 8 months in stainless steel and foudres (10%)

Alcohol: 14.5%

One of the greatest Southern Rhone vintages of the last decades, ripe and powerful but exquisitely structured and detailed wines.

"The "second wine" of Nalys, the 2016 Chateauneuf du Pape Saintes Pierres is a blend of 69% Grenache, 20% Syrah, 5% Cinsault, 4% Muscardin, and 1% each Counoise and Mourvèdre. It was put together by the Guigal team, although the vinifications took place prior to the acquisition. It's an attractive, full-bodied wine that delivers ripe cherries, a hint of stone fruit and very supple tannins."
